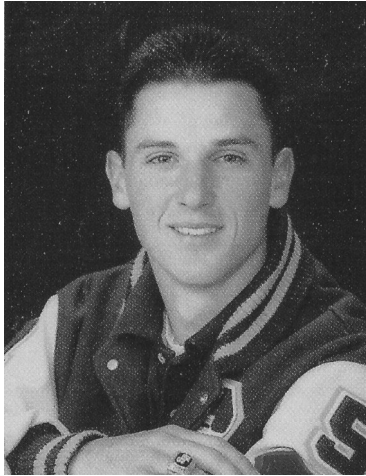


MIKE BARRROW JR.

Mike Barrow Jr. is a 2002 graduate of St. Bonaventure High School lettering in Football, Soccer and Baseball. He was the starting Varsity Place-Kicker his Sophomore, Junior and Senior years. The Seraphs went 14-0 each year winning TVL and CIF-SS Championships. In his Senior year, Mike was selected 1st team All TVL, 1st team All Ventura County, 1st team All-CIF-SS and 1st team All State. He still holds the school career Kick Scoring record with 184 points. In Baseball Mike started on the JV Baseball team as a 2nd baseman his Freshman and Sophomore years leading the team to TVL title. He was called up to Varsity late his Sophomore season and hit over .400 down the stretch drive. After sitting out his Junior year, Mike came back to play Baseball his Senior year during Coach Raul Camacho's 1st season. He didn't miss a beat as he took over the Starting Right fielders spot on a 20 win team that reached the CIF-SS Quarter-finals before getting knocked out 2-1 by nationally ranked # 10 Chaminade. Mike set a new school record for most home runs in a season hitting 7 in 2002 season (since broken by Jordan Farris). What made Mike's feat even more amazing was that the 7 he hit that season put him # 2 on the all time CAREER home run list for the Seraphs. He was an All-TVL and All County Selection in Baseball and won the school's Most Improved Player Award.

He continued his football career at the University of Idaho on a full ride scholarship. He was the starting Place-Kicker for the Vandals his Freshman, Sophomore and Junior Years and the starting Punter his Sophomore and Junior Years. In 2005, he was named 1st team All-WAC kicker and was a Semi-Finalist for the National Lou Groza Award (Awarded for the Most Outstanding Kicker in the nation.). He was also named U of Idaho Special Teams Player of the Year and was the WAC Special Teams Player of the Week for the Vandals win over New Mexico State (3 for 3 in Field Goals and 4 for 4 in extra points. He also averaged 43.3 yards per punt.). In 2005, he led the Vandals in scoring with 69 points, kicking 16 for 19 Field Goals (84.2%) including 7 for 8 beyond 40 yards. Prior to his Senior Season, He was named a Pre-Season All-American only to sustain a season ending injury before playing a game. He graduated from the University of Idaho in 2007. Mike currently resides in Camarillo and is married to fellow Bonaventure Alum Allison Hause, Class of 2003.
