Why we do service?

As a Catholic Christian school we work to share Christ with the world around us and bring His love to those we encounter. An important part of that is organized Christian Service. Christian Service is "a work of justice pleasing to God." (CCC, 2462).

Christian Service Requirement

- Students are required to do a minimum of 15 hours of service
 - NOTE: Not all hours have to be done for the same event or organization
- Two ways to complete hours
 - School Organized Volunteer Opportunities found on school website
 - Student Organized Volunteer Opportunities that are approved
- All hours are due by **Friday, May 8, 2020**
 - Christian Service done between July 1, 2019 - May 7, 2020 will count
 - If you completed hours of service over the summer and you have talked to Ms. Zabaglo or Mr. Palomares they can count

What Counts for Christian Service Hours?

Should Be

- Time spent helping in the community through either your church, a non-profit organization, or community projects which help spread the light of Christ to the world.

Examples that count:

- Organized beach clean up days
- Volunteering at a community event
- Working a Vacation Bible School
- Volunteering at an Animal Shelter
- Working a Many Meals night with SBHS
- Tutoring with an organization
- Being a Peer Leader for Youth Group

Should NOT Be

- Christian service hours should not be ordinary tasks you should already be doing. They should not be hours you are required to complete because of your involvement in a club/organization on campus (ASB or Leadership).

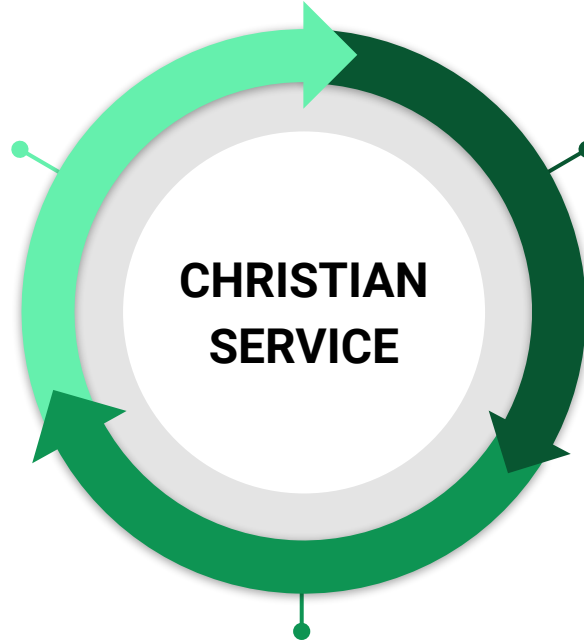
Examples that DO NOT count:

- Babysitting
- Jobs you get paid to do
- Chores at home
- Going to Church
- Projects for a class assignment
- Helping your neighbor take out their trash
- Tutoring a friend or sibling
